BEALALAW House, Myshall has been shortlisted for this year's Irish Architecture Awards.

The private building is the work of Ryan W Kennihan, Architects. The project was for the extension and renovation of an existing house. The addition is set at an informal angle to the existing house and grounded to the site with a long granite wall. Internally, the focus of the house is a large hall in three bays, which is

referred to by locals as 'the barn'.

The awards are run by the Royal **Institute of the Architects** of Ireland (RIAI). The national list, which contains 50-plus projects, also includes Aldi, Terenure; Humewood Castle; Waterford Fire Station; and the Dublin Port diving bell.

Now in its ninth year, the popular RIAI Public Choice Award gives people the opportunity to have their say by voting

for their favourite shortlisted project, which has the honour of being named Ireland's favourite building 2016. The RIAI encourages the public to vote for their favourite building online on www.irisharchitectureawards.ie or through the RIAI Facebook page.

The winners will be announced at an awards ceremony at the Royal Hospital Kilmainham on Friday 24 June.
