Workshop looks at Georgian Limerick

A WORKSHOP to help regenerate parts of Georgian Limerick will be held in the city this Wednesday night.

The Adaptive Governance Lab at the School of Architecture at University of Limerick is holding a community design workshop in the Fab Lab Limerick, No. 7 Rutland Street on September 14 from 6-7.30pm.

The workshop is a continuation of the work over the past year on the Living Georgian Limerick Project to identify and refine neighbourhood regeneration projects together with local collaborators.

"The projects are low cost, short term projects which can be done quickly, for little money and together with local residents and businesses to test out ideas to improve community life and living in Georgian Limerick.

They include proposals to transform parking spots to people spots, temporary street reconfigurations to reduce traffic speed and laneway thresholds to improve safety and attractiveness of these areas," said a spokesperson.

The design work will be presented at the Culture Night event 'Park Up and Picnic' on Friday, September 16, at 6pm on Mallow Street in front of the Canteen restaurant.

RIAI award winning architects will attend on the night to critique the work and to share their insights on improving public space.
